Enjoying lunch at the *Charleville RSL* Memorial Club and then visit the *Royal Flying Doctor Service Visitor Centre* to gain an incredible insight into this iconic remote service.

As the sun sets, we visit Charleville's best-known attraction, the **Cosmos Centre.** The centre is an audio-visual extravaganza featuring hi-tech interactive displays that take you on an astronomical journey through the ages, unravelling many mysteries of our night sky. Enjoy the open-air observatory and viewing of the outback night sky.

Embark on a tour through the workshop and the world of fluffy wonder before uncovering the rich history of the oldest town in the central west, where time seems to stand still. Enjoy lunch here before continuing on as we find ourselves in *Barcaldine*, a town steeped in the trials and triumphs of early pioneers and the profound evolution of Australia as a nation. The legendary *Tree of Knowledge*, an iconic ghost gum stands as a symbol of resilience and political transformation. It was here, under the shade of this iconic tree that the seeds of the Australian Labor Party were sown, forever shaping the country's landscape. Finally, our path leads us into *Longreach*, where we settle in for the next 4 nights, staying at Longreach Tourist Park Dinner taken onsite at the accommodation.

Enjoy lunch at the Drover's Place before having the rest of the day wandering and exploring the Longreach township. We meet up again over dinner at the tourist park.

Afterwards, we experience our own *BBQ picnic lunch* off the coach before visiting the *Waltzing Matilda Centre*, the only museum in the world dedicated to a song.

The world class museum and art gallery focuses on the Australian landscape, channel country, the women of the homesteads and livestock/wool industries of the outback. After a big travel day to Winton, we make our way back to Longreach.

First up today is a visit to the **School of Distance Education** that spans an area more than twice the size of Victoria. Enjoy lunch (own expense) and time to wander the town before arriving for our visit at the Qantas Founders Outback Museum. Exploring this world-class museum which eloquently narrates the incredible story of Australia's national airline from its humble beginnings in outback Queensland to its remarkable present-day achievements. This afternoon/early evening we take a gentle sunset cruise down the majestic Thomson River before going ashore for a traditional stockman's camp-fire dinner. A real outback experience with inspiring and humorous entertainment. Next, the bush is illuminated by the Starlight's Spectacular Sound & Light Picture Show, a unique big-screen presentation featuring the amazing adventures of notorious cattle thief known as 'Captain Starlight'. Finally, in the atmospheric surrounding of the bush at night, we enjoy the timeless favourite, billy tea and damper.

We also see the 25 metre high Van Gogh Sunflower painting that is part of a concept by Cameron Cross to erect seven Sunflower sculptures in seven different countries, reproducing Van Gogh's seven different Sunflower paintings. We travel south with a rest stop at *Springsure* then continue on to *Injune* located 90 kilometres north of Roma at the base of the majestic Carnarvon Ranges for lunch at *Cafe on Second*. By midafternoon we arrive at *Roma* and check in for overnight stay. Tonight, be ready to experience the *Night Show Sunset Experience* at the *Big Rig*.

As the sun sets, we relax under the outback sky and are taken on a sound and light journey to learn the entertaining trails and triumphs of the early industry men and women of Roma.
